What to Watch For:

- 1.Ensure your account is secure using a password that isn't easily guessed.
- 2.Enable Two-Factor Authentication (2FA). Requiring a verification code when logging in from new devices adds an extra layer of security.
- 3.Keep your liked videos, playlists, and subscriptions private or limited to specific users
- 4.Please look at the long-term impact of the videos you post, especially for public viewing.
- 5.Never reveal sensitive details like addresses or contact information in your content.
- 6.Avoid public Wi-Fi. You can always use secure networks to protect your data while accessing YouTube.
- 7.Regular updates help protect against security vulnerabilities.
- 8.Be wary of links in comments or messages that could lead to phishing sites.
- 9.Flag inappropriate content or users that breach YouTube's community guidelines.
- 10.Use YouTube's Restricted Mode. Filter out inappropriate videos with this feature.
- 11.You can use strong passwords and 2FA to protect the account linked to your YouTube profile.

- 13.Please be careful when you collaborate. Only work with trusted creators and don't share sensitive data.
- 14.Adhere to copyright laws. Ensure you have the correct permissions when using copyrighted material in your videos.
- 15.Familiarise yourself with YouTube's guidelines. Understand the platform's rules and policies to avoid violations.
- 16.Remove channels or users you no longer trust. Curate your subscriptions and contacts to ensure a positive experience.
- 17.Set up account recovery options. Add backup emails or phone numbers to recover your account if hacked.
- 18.Stay informed about new features and security enhancements via the YouTube blog
- 19.Review and update your privacy settings regularly. Ensure they meet your evolving needs for security.
